RULES & PROCEDURES

- **THE NJHSA BOARD RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MAKE FINAL DECISIONS RELATING TO THE INTERPRETATION OF SPECIFICATIONS AND THE ADJUDICATION OF THE HIGH SCORE RULES AND PROCEDURES.**
- The NJHSA is an Affiliate Member of the United States Hunter/Jumper Association (USHJA).
- The 2008 NJHSA Show Year is from September 1, 2007 through August 31, 2008.
- Riders, horses and ponies are eligible for High Score Awards ONLY if they are registered with the NJHSA and application fees have been paid. Membership becomes effective upon receipt of a completed application and the appropriate fees by the Membership Secretary, or by a Show Secretary at a NJHSA sanctioned horse show. Memberships completed at a horse show will be accepted only if submitted by the horse show secretary with horse show results.
- In cases of multiple ownership of a horse or pony, ALL owners of record must be NJHSA members or no points will be counted.
- A Transfer of Ownership must be filed for a horse or pony that is already recorded with the NJHSA. Points will be awarded to the new owner only from the date the Transfer Fees and paperwork are received by the NJHSA as above.
- A leased horse or pony must be exhibited under the legal owner's name as per USEF ownership rules. The legal owner (lessor) and the lessee must both be active members of the NJHSA. Exception: If said lease is recorded with the USEF then USEF rules will apply and the animal is shown under the lessee's name who must be an active member of the NJHSA.
- Stables, Farms or Corporations who wish to register their horses and ponies must be registered as members (one-time fee). An officer of the Stable, Farm or Corporation must be a current member of the NJHSA to activate the membership of the Stable, Farm or Corporation.

- **ELIGIBILITY DEFINITIONS:**
 - Junior Rider:** Has not reached his/her 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current Show Year (USEF Rules).
 - Novice Rider:** One who has not won three blue ribbons in Equitation in classes 2'6" or higher.
 - Limit Rider:** One who has not won six blue ribbons in Equitation in classes 3' or higher.
 - Adult Amateur Rider:** No longer eligible as a Junior Rider, and is eligible for USEF Amateur Certification.
- Be certain to check horse show prize lists to determine whether NJHSA Points are carried and will be counted.
- NJHSA Specifications for classes and divisions **MUST** be listed *correctly* in the body of the prizelist for points to count. If a genuine error is made, the NJHSA Executive Board must be notified immediately and the horse show management and exhibitors must follow the NJHSA Executive Board's decision on sanctioning the division and any procedure for correction.
- Members found to have misrepresented their eligibility will forfeit ALL points earned in that division. Thereafter, points will be awarded only in the correct division of eligibility.
- THREE (3) entries must be awarded ribbons in each class for points to count.
- A minimum of THREE (3) classes constitutes a division. Three classes must be run for Championship and Reserve Championship Bonus points to count. In Hunter Divisions, the three classes must include one Under Saddle Class. The maximum number of classes which may be offered in a section is 4 if held on one day, or 5 if held on more than one day, including the under saddle. A Classic cannot count towards the total number of classes offered to create a division, and will not be awarded NJHSA High Score points.
- A Hunter horse/pony **MUST** show in at least one over fences class for the under saddle points to count for that horse/pony.
- If a division is offered, but one or more classes is not completed, points will be awarded in classes that are filled and completed. No Champion or Reserve bonus points will be awarded unless three classes (including an Under Saddle class in hunter divisions) are filled and completed.
- In the event an individual changes age sections within a division (i.e. Younger Children's to Older Children's) during the awards year due to USEF age rules, all points accrued from September 1st through November 30th shall automatically roll into the new age section as of December 1st.

**SANCTIONING OF
POINTS AT A SHOW
(notes for Show Management)**

- Fees for holding points: \$100.00 per show
- A Horse Show application must be filed 14 days in advance of the show, and show fees are due at the time of application. Show fees are considered late if paid any time after results of the show are submitted.
- No credit will be given for classes canceled or not filled. If an entire show must be canceled, management may apply to the NJHSA for credit towards a future show.
- Splitting classes or divisions is permitted as long as a minimum of three classes are held for each section.
- NJHSA Classes/Divisions should be identified as such in the body of the prizelist. NJHSA High Score Awards Sponsors should be listed in the prize list as they appear in these Specifications or in supplemental information. If any classes or divisions are marked in the prizelist as recognized by the NJHSA the show will be expected to pay for such recognition.
- A copy of these Rules & Specifications should be made available to the exhibitors, managers, secretaries and stewards on the day of the show.
- RESULTS from the Show Secretary must be sent to the NJHSA Point Secretary within TEN days of the date of the show. A copy of the prizelist MUST be sent with the results.
- Any violation of the NJHSA High Score Awards Rules and Specifications will be considered the fault of the show management and NOT the NJHSA.
- It is each exhibitor's responsibility to join the NJHSA in a timely manner, know the rules of the organization and to keep accurate show records for verification of points earned. Please contact the Point Secretary immediately if you have any questions.

IMPORTANT:

The NJHSA has established a record keeping rule which will finalize the point standings for all exhibitors at a mid-year date chosen by the Executive Board. This date for 2008 is April 30, 2008. Once points are finalized for this deadline by the Point Secretary, and approved by the Executive Board, the points up until that date cannot be changed *for any reason*.

The NJHSA Board reserves the right to make final decisions relating to the interpretation and adjudication of the High Score Rules, Specifications, and all Policy and Procedures.

**CHAMPIONSHIP OR RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIP
BONUS POINTS FOR HUNTER, EQUITATION &
PLEASURE DIVISIONS:**

Championship - 10 points, Reserve Championship - 5 points

Please note that points for Championship and Reserve Championship DO NOT change with the number of entries.

No Championship Bonus points awarded in any Jumper Divisions.

**DETERMINING CHAMPION & RESERVE TITLES
For all Hunter and Pleasure Divisions:**

Ribbon: 1st -10 points

2nd - 6

3rd - 4

4th - 2

5th - 1

6th - 1/2

Only the top four horses will receive points for ribbons won in the under saddle class. Ties will go to the horse scoring the most points over fences.

For the Equitation Divisions:

Ribbon: 1st - 5 points

2nd - 3

3rd - 2

4th - 1

Any ties will remain tied and receive equal points.

CLASS AND DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

The NJHSA Board reserves the right to make final decisions relating to the interpretation and adjudication of the class and division specifications.

MINI STIRRUP WALK-TROT DIVISION

Sponsored by The Svoboda Family, Oldwick, NJ
In Memory of "Polished Brass"

An **Achievement Award** for this division will be given to every rider who accumulates a total of 500 points. Once a rider wins 500 points in Mini Stirrup he or she will receive an "Achievement Award". A rider may continue to show in the Mini Stirrup Division, or may show in another division where eligible without losing his or her Achievement Award for the current year. Riders are cautioned to be careful when advancing out of the Mini Stirrup division when interest is shown in other High Score Programs or Divisions, or in Finals-type horse shows. This is not a High Score Division. Only Achievement Awards will be given to riders who reach the Achievement level of 500 points. No Champion or Reserve will be awarded, and no placement awards will be given to riders who do not reach the Achievement level.

Open to riders 10 years of age or under as of the current show year. Riders not to have shown over fences 2' or higher at a USEF Recognized show. Riders may not cross-enter into any other class or division at the same show where they are required to canter. The division must include at **least three** of the following classes:

Walk-Trot Equitation
Walk-Trot Pleasure
Walk-Trot Figure Eight

Cross Rails - 4 crossrails under 2'. Management is required to mark the judge's card and course description with the specific specifications of this class as "cantering is NOT required."

NOTE: Once a rider jumps 2' or higher in any USEF or NJHSA Recognized Show, that rider is no longer eligible for Mini Stirrup, Short Stirrup Equitation or Short Stirrup Hunter.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION DIVISION

Open to riders 12 years of age or under as of the current show year. Rider not to have not shown over fences 2' or higher at a USEF Recognized show. Riders may not cross-enter into any division except Pleasure and Short Stirrup Hunter. Classes to be offered should include:

Walk-Trot - To be shown both ways of the ring.
Walk-Trot-Canter - To be shown both ways of the

ring, no more than 10 to canter at one time.

Over Fences - To be shown over a minimum of 4 fences under 2'. May be crossrails.

NOTE: Once a rider jumps 2' or higher in any USEF or NJHSA Recognized Show, that rider is no longer eligible for Mini Stirrup, Short Stirrup Equitation or Short Stirrup Hunter.

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER DIVISION

Open to horses and ponies ridden by riders eligible for Short Stirrup Equitation (see above). Manners and suitability to count. It is recommended that the classes be held in a ring and must include:

Under Saddle(1) - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No more than 10 to canter at one time. No martingales.

Over Fences (minimum of 2) - A minimum of 4 fences under 2'. Fences may be crossrails.

NOTE: Once a rider jumps 2' or higher in any USEF or NJHSA Recognized Show, that rider is no longer eligible for Mini Stirrup, Short Stirrup Equitation or Short Stirrup Hunter.

PRE-CHILDREN'S HUNTER DIVISIONS

Separate High Score Awards will be given to the highest scoring horse and the highest scoring pony.

Open to horses and ponies ridden by junior riders who are still eligible as Limit Equitation riders. Riders may not cross-enter at the same show into the Children's Hunter, Pony Hunter or any class/division where fences exceed 2'9". Classes must include:

Under Saddle (1) - To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales.

Over Fences (minimum of 2) - A hunter course of at least 8 fences. Ponies to jump 2', horses to jump 2'6"

PRE-CHILDREN'S EQUITATION DIVISION

Separate High Score Awards will be given to the highest scoring rider on a horse and the highest scoring rider on a pony.

Open to junior riders who are still eligible as Limit Equitation riders. Riders may not cross-enter at the same show into the Children's Hunter, Pony Hunter or any class/division where fences exceed 2'9". If the division is split a rider may show in only one section at that show. Classes must include:

Flat Class (1) - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales.

Over Fences (minimum of 2) - To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences at 2'6" for horses, 2' for ponies.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY DIVISION

Separate High Score Awards will be given to the highest scoring Large Pony and the highest scoring Small or Medium Pony.

Small/Medium award sponsored by

To be run according to current USEF Zone II Specifications which are: To be shown by junior exhibitors. Fence height to be 2' for small and medium ponies, 2'6" for large ponies; spreads not to exceed fence heights. Riders may cross enter only in unrated classes and any equitation classes not to exceed 3'6." Riders may cross enter between the Children's Hunter Pony and Children's Hunter Horse division at the same competition. Horses and ponies may cross enter only in unrated classes, Equitation classes not to exceed 3'6", Adult Amateur Hunters, and First Year Green and Second Year Green Hunters, if otherwise eligible.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE DIVISION

Separate High Score Awards will be given to the highest scoring horse shown by a rider ages 14 & under, and the highest scoring horse shown by a rider ages 15-17.

Riders may cross enter only in unrated classes and any equitation classes not to exceed 3'6." Riders may cross enter between the Children's Hunter Pony and Children's Hunter Horse division at the same competition. Horses and ponies may cross enter only in unrated classes, Equitation classes not to exceed 3'6", Adult Amateur Hunters, and First Year Green and Second Year Green Hunters, if otherwise eligible.

To be awarded to the highest scoring horse or pony
in all of the Children's Hunter Divisions.

NJHSA JUNIOR BRONZE MEDAL CLASS

A single class open to Junior Riders who have not won 6 first place ribbons (ref: General Eligibility Rule) as of December 1st of the current show year. To be shown over at least 8 fences at 3' with one change of direction and at least one combination. Optional Tests 1-7.

NJHSA MINI MACLAY CLASS

A single class open to Junior Riders who have not won a first place in a USEF Medal, ASPCA Maclay, Washington Intl. Eq., or USET Medal Class prior to December 1st of the current show year. To be shown over a course of at least 8 fences 3' to 3'3" with or without wings, including a change of direction and at least one combination. A minimum of 12 riders, if available, to show on the flat. Flat phase to count 50%. Judged on hands, seat, guidance and control of the horse. One rider per horse. Mount must stay the same throughout the phases.

NJHSA GOLD MEDAL CLASS

A single class open to Junior Riders. To be shown over a course of at least 8 fences at 3'6", which includes at least one combination, an oxer and two changes of direction. One rider per horse.

Under Saddle (1) - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales.

Over Fences (minimum of 2) - To be shown over a hunter course of at least 8 fences at 2'6".

Riders may not compete in any other classes at the same competition where fences exceed 3'3", except Adult Amateur Jumper. Horses may be shown by a different rider in any other division or class at the same competition. Horses may be jogged for soundness at the discretion of the judge.



SCHOOLING HUNTER DIVISION

Open to all. To be judged on performance and soundness with an emphasis on manners. Classes must include:

Under Saddle (1) - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales.

Over Fences (minimum of 2) - To be shown over a hunter course of at least 8 fences at 2'6" to 2'9".

SUITABLE HUNTER DIVISION

Open to all. To be judged on performance and soundness with emphasis on manners and suitability. Classes must include:

Under Saddle (1) - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales.

Over Fences (minimum of 2) - To be shown over a hunter course of at least 8 fences at about 3'.

To be judged with emphasis on manners and suitability as well as soundness and performance. Must back readily and stand quietly. No more than 8 to hand gallop at the same time. No martingales. A minimum of three classes to be offered.

Division *may* include Cross Country Pleasure that is to include at least one of the following tests:

- 1) trot or canter over cavaletti
- 2) trot or lead over small jumps
- 3) back between two ground rails

The Pleasure Division may be split into horses and ponies as two separate sections if entries warrant.

JUMPERS

- All jumper classes (except Classics) will receive NJHSA Points regardless of the number of classes offered at the show.
- No NJHSA Champion or Reserve Champion Bonus points will be awarded in any Jumper Division.
- For the 2008 Show Year, a Jumper Class need not be named exactly for points to count towards its respective High Score Award, as long as said class meets the height and spread requirements of the section (exc. Child/Adult points will awarded only in the specific High Score for Child/Adult.)

LEVEL 0 (ZERO) JUMPER

(formerly PrePreliminary Jumper)

Open to all horses and ponies. All classes to be run concurrent with USEF Tables. Fences set according to USEF Level Zero at 2'9".

LEVEL 1 (ONE) or 2 (TWO) JUMPER

Level 1 - 3'0" in height, 3' to 3'6" in spread
